What is UK Youth Parliament?

UK Youth Parliament (UKYP) provides opportunities for young people to be elected as a member of the youth parliament (MYP and Deputies) representing Shropshire so that young people can have a voice and influence social change. UKYP offer a number of active involvement activities across the

year. This includes:

Regional meetings

House of Commons debates

Regular dialogue with ministers, including the prime minister and opposition spokespeople

Inputs to policy and programme development

Who is it for?

UK Youth Parliament is available for any young person aged between 11 - 17 years who lives in the Shropshire borough.

Members will create a campaign about why they should be a MYP and other young people will take part in the democratic process of voting for who they think the best candidate is.
